

sun of the beach 2014 - Rules

Please note, there won't be a captains meeting. All teams are expected to be familiar with the rules below.

Pool play and play-offs

The teams are divided in 3 pools of 5 and 3 pools of 4 teams each. The top two teams of every pool will proceed to the power pools O1-O4 of 3 teams each. The result of the game between the top 2 teams of pool A, B, C will be taken to the power pool. The bottom 3 teams of pool A, B, C and the bottom 2 teams of pool D, E, F will proceed to the lower pools U1-U3. Results of games between teams of the same 1st-round pool will be taken to these new pools.

On Sunday morning will be played the last games of the pools U1, U2, U3. After the 2nd-round pool play the top two teams of the pools O1-O4 will play quarters, semis and finals on Sunday. The teams placed 3 in these pools will play for the positions 09-12. The teams of the lower pools will play against the same placed teams of the particular other pools for the positions 13-15, 16-18, 19-21, 22-24 and 24-27.

On Saturday games are played up to 13 (point cap) or 35 minutes + 1 goal (see rules about time cap). There is a half time at 7 (just switching offence without a break) and every team has one time out per game. There is no time out in the time cap.

Games on Sunday will be played up to 13 (point cap) or 40 minutes.

Except the third placed teams of pool A, B, C teams will play 5 games on Saturday and 3 on Sunday, these 3 teams will play 6 games on Saturday and 2 on Sunday.

Point cap

If one team scores 13 points before the time is up and leads by two or more points the game is over. If the score is 13:12 game is played to 15 or until a team leads by two points.

Time cap

If one team leads by two or more points when time is up, the game is over. Otherwise one point is added to the highest score and the first team to reach that score will win.

Brick

If the pull lands out of bounds, the receiver can choose to play from the brick point seven steps in front of the goal line.

Ties

If several teams end up with an equal number of wins in pool play, we then consider

1. results in prior games between the teams in question
2. goal difference between the teams in question
3. total goal difference in the pool
4. flip a disc
